Dreaming of a clubhouse Christmas

It's December again, cold & snowing, and as I sit in CCF&G's little clubhouse having lunch I think to the future and what our indoor range will mean.

Imagine that in a few years we can have a club Christmas party with enough space to gather and watch the juniors shooting a match. The ladies can come for their Saturday pistol club without freezing, members can shoot inside all week long in pistol and rifle leagues, and we can come in any time to just shoot for fun.

I look forward to the educational and safety programs, and I wonder what other interesting presentations our classroom will host. We can have all of this, and a nice bite to eat too, in the same building.

The plans for the range & training facility are ready and we've received site plan approval from the city. We're beginning the marketing and fundraising effort, and want to be sure that everyone understands the project.

We'll build in at least two parts. Phase 1 will cost approximately \$2.8 million and will include 14 shooting lanes, a classroom, office and lobby.

The second phase, to come later, will include further enhancements, including a cafeteria, more classrooms, and

dedicated archery & air rifle ranges.

Funds for the project will come from donations. The plan is to NOT to have to increase membership dues. We want members to use the indoor range in the same way we currently use the outdoor ranges—with no additional charges. We believe the new facility will attract a significant number of new members to help us cover costs.

Our club is growing, with our membership this year hitting 840 and expected to top 900 next year. The new facility will help us to attract new members and make it possible to have a stronger and more vibrant club in the future. Watch for more details on the website and newsletter.

600 yard range 80-percent complete

With winter upon us, the visible progress on the 600 yard range has stopped, but it was a great Fall.

A great deal of progress was made in September, October and November. The mild weather allowed us to pour concrete in the pits in 12 separate pours.

The Target pillars, footings, frost wall, pit wall, pit house and walkway are done. More than 85 yards of concrete and 6000 feet of reinforcing steel have been used so far. Partial backfilling was accomplished to prevent frost damage over the winter. The floor of the pit house remains to be poured.

Over the winter the hi-power crew will be busy with many tasks, including; number boards, target frames and perhaps even some frame repair and painting.

When spring arrives, we will be backfilling, grading, seeding and pouring the floor of the pit house. We plan to be working on the firing line as well, using material from the decommissioning of the dam on the club property.

If you see Pete Desantis, Warren Neumeister, Al Giles, Dave Smith, Neil Jeneral, Ed Csenge or Bob Felock

thank them for their much appreciated "volunteer time." We also want to thank Carl Ellsworth for his craftsmanship in completing the concrete work.

We are approximately 80-percent complete on this project, and plan to have a non-sanctioned event in June as a "shake down" shoot.

We are still looking for financial support for this 600 Yard Project through Member Support to the Club with a 'Promissory Note' loan to the Club. The goal set for the completion of the 600 Yard Range Project in October 2013 was an additional \$40,000.00 to be raised through loans to the Club under 5 year Promissory Notes that will pay 4% interest per year to the lender.

To date we have raised only \$11,000.00 through these notes. We have had some interest shown by a few other people, but still need to have more participation. We would like to think that we were correct in believing that members would be willing to support major projects by loaning the Club money as an alternative to just donating money.

Recreational Pistol

2013 was a very good year!

Eight matches were held April thru November. The additional pistol bays greatly reduced the wait times for shooters, allowed us to set up more and better courses of fire (stages) and kept a pistol bay open for other club members.

There were a total of 165 shooters (average of 20 shooters per match) including 28 acting as Safety Officers (see below). We charge \$15 per shooter and Safety Officers shoot for free.

With revenue from matches we purchased a used MGM attack target for \$500 (which costs \$2000 new) to add to the shooting props the club owns & two new shot timers for \$250.

We also purchased a Dueling Tree from Action Target for \$520 that will handle up to .44 mag. The Dueling

Tree will be left on one of the pistol bays for all club members to enjoy.

Our beginning balance for 2013 was \$900 and revenue from matches was \$1980. Expenses & purchases were \$1580 & we turned \$1000 into the club treasury. This leaves us with \$300 to start the 2014 season.

Using the winter ranges

We will do our best to keep most of the ranges open and functional throughout the winter.

We will have several snow shovels on the range. If you're the first one there after it snows, it's okay for you to pitch in and move some snow out of the way.

The clubhouse is always accessible. Please remember to lock the door when you leave.

We will keep a path to the 100/200 yard open range benches. The road to the 200 yard pits will be kept plowed. You'll need to stomp a path to the 50 yard and 100 yard target frames if you're shooting from there. We will keep the 100 yard and 200 yard gongs up.

We will keep the 100 yard covered range cleared out and will snow blow a path down to 100 yards. Please put the aluminum shooting benches back to the center posts and leave the individual benches locked in the up position to make it easier to clean the snow out.

For both covered ranges please return the portable steel target bases under the cover when not in use, not left out to be buried by a snowstorm. This will keep them available for use all winter and we won't have to worry about the snow blower scooping one up.

Pistol Bay #1 has the front panels on them so you will need to shoot out through the sliding glass openings. Close the panels when you're done shooting. A path will be maintained down range here as well.

We are leaving the 'plate rack' on Pistol Bay #2 and will maintain the road up to it. The bench will be moved back to the edge of the road and we will move the plate rack closer to the bench & table.

Remember, a staple gun & staples should be in your range bag, but there is a 'loaner' in the clubhouse if you forget.

Jr. Rifle Team still needs .22 ammo

You'll remember in the last newsletter that I said I wasn't in a panic yet... However, I'm getting close.

Some of you responded to my plea and were able to either sell or donate ammo to us. Some provided us with leads on .22 ammo. But standard velocity .22 ammo continues to be extremely hard to come by.

We have four cases of .22 ammunition coming through a grant from the YSSA, but they have not indicated when it would be available.

We're averaging about 25 shooters per week. That amounts to about 10 bricks (a case) per month. We still have five months left in this season. Fortunately, the Gold & Silver Team shooters have been doing Air Rifle in December and early January, but after their a sectional match in January, they will be back full time with .22 rifle.

The stuff we're looking for should be in the \$20 - \$30 per brick range and American made-- CCI, Federal, Remington, Winchester, etc. But if something else is reliable, then we certainly would put it to use.

We have instructed over 800 women in the 8+ years we have been running the WOT program. Fortunately the weather has been good for every WOT so far. Hopefully we'll be as lucky for our 2014 sessions.

Though most participants show up nervous, all leave enthusiastic and smiling about the great time they had. The morning is divided into 3 groups of 10 women: 10 to handgun, 10 to rifle and 10 to shotgun.

After safety instructions for each discipline, you hear the rapid fire of pistol, the more precision paced shooting of the rifles, and the cheers for hitting the clay pigeon for the first time. After a short time, each group is moved to try another discipline. At the end, its door prizes, gift bags and lunch where they can talk with the instructors/volunteers they met.

As this class fills up very fast, if you are thinking of signing up or know of someone who is interested, please do so immediately to secure a spot. Keep checking the website for dates and download the application and mail it in with your payment to reserve your space.

The dates for 2014 are May 18th and September 14th. The applications should be posted in early March.

We are also in the starting phase of a monthly women's pistol shoot. Ladies can bring their own handgun, ammo, eyes & ear protection and practice shooting their handgun in the company

of other women. (For \$2, you can borrow one of the Club's .22 pistols.) That is not to say there will be no men there. We can always use their expertise with

any questions/problems that might be encountered. Currently the shoots are held on the 3rd Saturday of the month from 9 to 11 a.m. Check with Sophie Chapman at the club.

It is a very volunteer intensive program, and I would like to thank all the great volunteers we have had, including those that have been involved since the beginning and those that are new each year. Without you, we would not have this program.

As a service to Club members, we are offering a 'gun value' service. It will be available at two levels.

1) At no cost (for members only) we will provide a basic "Blue Book of Gun / Air Gun" value based on your description of the firearm's condition. (There is a five item limit on this level.)

2) At a cost of \$3 per item, or \$5 for every two items, we will provide a detailed description and value range for your firearm based on the "Blue Book" and at least one 'on line' source provided if it can be found. Non member cost is \$4 per item for the detailed description and value range.

Maybe you're looking to buy or sell a firearm, or perhaps just preparing a list of the firearms you own for your information or having to itemize a claim for your firearms. If so, this an excellent way to document the value.

Remember, it's always a good idea to have a good photo of your individual firearms to accompany your list.

These items are a great way to show your support for the Club. Wear them proudly.

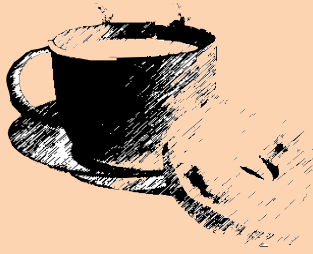
We also have taken on a line of gun cleaning products by Winchester for \$10 each.

Fly Tying Class to be held at CCF&G

The Monadnock Chapter of Trout Unlimited will offer Fly Tying Classes at the Cheshire County Fish and Game Club in Keene, NH beginning February.
